

# ANCIENT EGYPT BOARD GAME

## TO PLAY:

- Print out the game board and game cards, cut the game cards apart. Shuffle the game cards and place them face down on the table.
- Have each player pick a coin, or other small object, to use as their place marker.
- Decide which player will answer the first question. The player to their left picks up a game card and reads the question.
- If the question is answered correctly the player moves the number of spaces signified on the card. If the card has (3) the player would move 3 spaces ahead, following the arrows on the gameboard. Questions are scored according to difficulty.
- Shuffle and reuse game cards as needed. There are blank cards included in case you want to add your own questions (a great way to reinforce learning!)
- The first player to reach the end of the game board wins!
